Hello Saints Family. Welcome to our 2014-2015 School Year. I look forward to working with you to empower our students through knowledge to be productive citizens. Students in 7th grade will only be administered the ITBS and CogAT during the month of October. CogAT results are used for program qualification for students that need SST, RTI or Exceptional Education . ITBS results are used for program qualification for magnet, high achievers, and gifted students. We look forward to every child demonstrating their mastery in both tests.



New Test in Georgia

The Georgia Milestones Assessment will begin during the 2014-2015 School Year. This test replaces the CRCT, EOCT, and Writing Assessment for grades 3-8 and high school students. It will include open—ended questions to evaluate better the students' concept mastery. Open-ended items (also known as constructed response) ask students to provide both short answer and extended types of responses. Multiple choice questions will not be included. The new assessments will enable educators to deepen their understanding of student's progress from one grade to the next and just as importantly, identify any gaps in progress so they can address them well before students enter college or the workforce. Examples of the Language Arts and Math portion are below.

The Language Arts portion will demonstrate the following:

- ♦ Whether students can read and comprehend contexts of varying complexities.
- How well students can use information from multiple sources to effectively summarize key points or make a persuasive argument.
- The degree to which students can use context to determine the meaning of academic vocabulary.

The Math portion will demonstrate the following:

- Whether students understand and can use important math ideas, including number sense, algebraic thinking, geometry, and data analysis.
- The extent to which students can use math facts and reasoning skill to solve real world problems.
- How well students can make mathematical arguments.

Do you know that as a parent your relationship with your child's school faculty and staff is as vital as your relationship with your child? It is more than simply hearing from the teacher every once in a while or reviewing the weekly communicator the teacher sends home. Your child's administrative team should also know who you are along with the administrative assistants and even the custodial staff. All of these people impact the daily life of your child from checking their attendance all the way to making sure they have a clean place to learn. Knowing the staff and faculty of the school, teaches your child the importance of community. Being aware for the school community teaches your child the importance of roles and responsibility. Being aware of the school community also teaches your child that as a parent you have a place in the school. You should feel a sense of security when sending your child to school, but how

can you feel secure if you don't know the people in the school? There is a shocking difference in the demeanor of a child who has a parent that is involved in their academic career opposed to a child whose parent is not. Our children need validations. Free and Reduced Meals

Applications for free and reduced meals are distributed to students at the beginning of the school year. At all other times, applications are available from the school nutrition manager. In order for your child to continue to receive free and reduced meals, please have their form turned into the office by September 19, 2014. Failure to do so will result in your child having to pay full price for lunch. The United States Department of Agriculture, Food and Nutrition Services Department has translated the state prototype Free and Reduced Price School Meal Family Application into 33 other languages. If you are unable to use this site in the provided languages (English and Spanish) please use the other languages link to download and print the application in your primary language. Submit the completed application to your local School Nutrition Manager or to the School Nutrition Scanning Office, 5855 Memorial Drive, Stone Mountain, GA.

Infinite Campus

In the 2014-2015 school year DeKalb County has launched a new information system that will enhance teacher to parent communication and sustainability.

Infinite Campus is a new database system that will provide parents in real—time information about their child's achievements as it is happening in the classroom.

The program consists of different tabs to view your child's productivity. The tabs include: Daily planner tab to view the child's schedule and assignments due; Assignments tab to view all assignments by specific class and due date; and Attendance tab to view events in summary and detail form. You can also view your child's grades anytime, you don't have to wait until their report card comes out.

To access the portal parents will need to get an activation code and create a username and password. Parents that have the previous parent portal information can use the same user ID and password for Infinite Campus. If the parent have forgotten their password, just visit https://campus.dekalb.isp and click on the DCSD portal account activation. From this

point the parent will be asked to enter the child's seven digit school district's student number (also known as the EIN number), the child's nine digit social security number, and the child's date of birth. Then click the submit button. Once logged into the portal , if a parent does not see all of their children then visit the main web page at www.dekalb.k12.qa.us and complete the form titled Combine Student Request Form. All students are automatically issued their own campus portal account within 24 hours of enrolling into DeKalb County School District. Parents and students should come to our CGMS Counseling Office for additional information.

For more convenience Infinite Campus is also available as an app on your mobile Android or Apple devices. Just download the app from your Google Play or App store. When the screen comes up for Infinite Campus, link up your phone to your "IC" account by entering DeKalb County's code, FLZLHV. If you have any more questions or concerns a campus portal support line is available Monday-Friday from 8:30am-8:00pm at 678-676-1131.
